Day 1 : Airport / Negombo (15 km of road)

Arrival at Colombo International Airport. Welcome by our representative with frangipani garlands. Departure by road to Negombo. Arrival and installation at the hotel. Evening: visit the city of Negombo, a major city in Sri Lanka, located on the west coast of the island and at the mouth of a lagoon. Negombo is the fourth largest city in the country after the capital Colombo, Kandy and Jaffna. It is one of Sri Lanka's main commercial centers, with about 128,000 inhabitants, about 37 km north of Colombo. Negombo is known for its very important fishing industry, its lively fish markets, and beautiful sandy beach

Day 2 : Negombo/ Pinnawala /Dambulla

(170 km)

After breakfast, departure for Pinnawala to visit the elephant orphanage which houses sixty pachyderms: we will attend the meal of elephants and also their bath in the nearby river. This orphanage was created in 1975 to accommodate young elephants lost for various reasons: disruption of their natural habitat by planning projects, abandonment by parents when they fall into holes or ravines. Some animals are sick or injured when they arrive at the orphanage where they are then treated. Departure for Dambulla. Afternoon: visit the rock temple of Dambulla. In Sri Lanka, there are many ancient cave-temples, but the golden temple of Dambulla is the most revered and best known. The temple includes five caves-sanctuaries that contain 157 statues, 153 images of the Buddha and 4 images of deities. It is believed that King Valagamba took refuge in the caves of Dambulla when he fled the Indian invaders. A Buddhist monk who was in these caves welcomed the king and protected him. When the king recovered his throne, he turned the caves into sanctuaries to show his gratitude to the monk. The second king who participated in the renovation of the caves is called Nissankamalla. Of Indian origin, he wanted to win the acceptance and affection of his people. He gave great importance to Buddhism and committed

to renovating old Buddhist temples and building new ones. According to Mahavamsa, (a historical record about Sri Lanka,) King Nissankamalla donated 73 golden sculptures to the Dambulla Temple and ordered a major renovation. The Dambulla Temple was named a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1991. Check in and check in at the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel

Day 3 : Dambulla / Sigiriya / Hiriwadunna / Dambulla

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to visit the fortress of Sigiriya. Sigiriya is, still today, a prodigious place. A massive red stone monolith stands 200 meters above the green jungle and stands out against the bright blue sky. At the height of its ephemeral glory, eighteen years at the end of the fifth century, it was one of the most charming royal cities ever seen on earth. The ruins of this legendary palace are scattered all over the peak of the "Lion Rock", so named, because formerly the visitors had to, for the final hard climb, pass through the jaws of the throat of a lion carved in mid - path of the summit of the monolith. Today only the gigantic legs remain. The main interest of the visit lies in the almost contemporary frescoes of the famous Indian paintings of Ajanta; but, here, there are real frescoes, paintings done on a fresh coating. These paintings consist of twenty-one female figures, represented half-way, gracefully bearing flowers. Beauty pure and striking, without sensitivity, they are one of the peaks of universal art. Afternoon: visit the village of Hiriwadunna to visit it by oxcart, and boat on the lake. Return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

The farm keeps these eggs buried in the sand away from predators and ensures, hatching, the safe passage of baby turtles to the sea. Visitors can see large vats filled with babies. 

This is an easy hike that will give you from the top a splendid panoramic view. You walk through green tea plantations, waterfalls and rice paddies. You have to hike early in the morning to enjoy the light and the sky. Lunch in a local restaurant. Afternoon: visit the bridge of 9 arches. Demodara is a city in the highlands of Sri Lanka. It is served by the railway station of Sri Lanka on the branch Badulla. There is a spiral at this place. The bridge is easily visible from the Demodara station. This is a tunnel that actually goes under the Demodara station. On the existing track, the tunnel is around a mountain, rising continuously to reach a higher altitude on what was the mountain under which the tunnel is built. Dinner in a local restaurant. Night at the youth hostel.



Days 7 : Ella /Udawalawe

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure for Udawalawe. Stop at the Ravana waterfall. The falls were named after the legendary King Ravana, who is connected to the famous Indian epic, the Ramayana. According to legend, it is said that Ravana (who was the king of Sri Lanka at the time) abducted Princess Sita, and hid her in the caves behind this waterfall. The reason for the kidnapping was revenge for slicing her sister's nose by Rama (Sita's husband) and his brother Laxmana. At the time, the cave was surrounded by thick forests. It is also believed that the Queen of Rama was bathing in a pool that accumulates water falling from this waterfall. Arrival and check-in at the hotel. Lunch at the hotel. Afternoon: 4x4 safari in Udawalawe National Park, covering 310 km² around a giant reservoir. There are about 500 wild elephants, as well as many mammals including some leopards. This reserve is also famous for its variety of birds. Return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Days 8 : Udawalawe / Mirissa

Breakfast at the hotel. Visit the Elephant Transit Home in Udawalawe. Udawalawe Elephant transit home is an establishment in Udawalawe National Park in Sri Lanka that was established in 1995 by the Department of Wildlife Conservation in Sri Lanka. Its main goal is to rehabilitate orphan elephants for the ultimate release in the wild. Baby Elephants have all the amenities and luxuries they need in the elephant transit house and are supplied with enough food and drinking water. Elephants roam freely and are able to provide food by grazing in a peaceful and natural environment. This normally occurs during the day and the feeding program is scheduled in three

hour intervals starting at 06:00 every day. In addition to this, elephants have their freedom to play as well as the necessary amenities are available. The milk provided is specially formulated to help in the development of these baby elephants. Departure for Mirissa. Breakfast in a local restaurant. Arrival and check-in at the hotel, then free time at the beach. Dinner in a local restaurant. Night at the youth hostel.

Days 9 : Mirissa / Colombo

Morning: Breakfast at the hotel. Visit the city of Galle. Galle is a superb example of a fortified city built by Europeans in South and Southeast Asia, illustrating the interactions between European architectural styles and South Asian traditions from the 16th to the 19th century. The old town of Galle, with its fort and fortifications protecting narrow streets where you can still see some old Dutch houses, is a World Heritage Site. Indeed, it represents the largest fortress built in Asia by European settlers. 

Day 1 : Airport of Colombo/ Negombo (15 km)

Arrival at Colombo International Airport. Welcome by our representative. Departure for Negombo. Arrival and check-in at the hotel. Free time In the afternoon, you have the choice between several options:

- Option 01 Exploring the fishing village by bike (2-3 hours).
- Option 02 Deep Sea Fishing Trip to Negombo (3 hours) (best seasons from February to April, and from October to December)
- Option 03 Bird Watching at Muthurajawela by Boat (2h00)

Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight.

Days 2 : Negombo / Yapahuwa / Anuradhapura

(180 km, 4h30 of road)

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure for Yapahuwa to visit the rock fortress Yapahuwa is located in the Wayamba province of Sri Lanka. It was the capital of Sri Lanka in the latter part of the 13th century (1273-1284). Built on a massive rocky 90-meter block in the style of Sigiriya Rock-fortress, Yapahuwa was a palace and military fortress against foreign invaders. At the top of the rock are the remains of a stupa, a Bodhi box, and a rock shelter / cave used by Buddhist monks, stating that, earlier this site was used as a Buddhist monastery, at the like many rocks and hills in the area. There are several caves at the base of the rock. Departure for Anuradhapura. Arrival and check-in at the hotel. Evening: visit of the city, monuments of the 3rd century BC and 8 sacred temples for Buddhists. Political and religious capital of Ceylon for 1,300 years, Anuradhapura was abandoned for Polonnaruwa in 993 following invasions. Long buried in thick jungle, the city, with its palaces and monasteries, is accessible again. Founded in the 6th century BC by King Pandukabhaya, it was the capital of Sri Lanka from the 4th to the 11th century BC. Today, this ancient city has become sacred for Buddhists with its monasteries that extend for 40 km. It is considered one of the major archaeological sites of the country. According to Mahavamsa, the city is called Anuradhapura in tribute to a minister, pioneer of the construction of the city, called Anuradha. This minister served King Vijaya who founded the Sinhalese ethnic group. Night and diner at the hostel.

Included meals: breakfast, lunch and dinner.



Day 3 : Anuradhapura / Aukana / Namal Uyana / Dambulla (100 km, 2h30 of road)

Breakfast at the hotel. Visit the statue of Buddha in Avukana. The statue of Avukana dates from the 5th century, it is 13 meters high and it is undoubtedly the oldest and best preserved sculpture of the island. This Buddha, erected by King Dhatusena, is today sheltered by a modern construction. Afternoon: departure to visit the "Namal Uyana". The Namal Uyana in Sri Lanka is the largest ironwood forest and rose quartz mountain in Asia. The Ironwood tree is endemic in Sri Lanka and the replanted forest covers more than 260 acres. According to the findings of archeological researchers, pink quartz in this historic place has a history of more than 550 million years. Naamal Uyana is an extremely rare forest replanted with ironwood trees in the 8th century AD started during the beginning of King Devanampiyathissa and ending with King Dappula IV. Namal Uyana had been a sanctuary for Buddhist monks during the reign of King Devanampiyatissa in the 8th century. Later, it was used as a prison camp where the punishment was to plant Na trees. The period of King Dappula declared it as a human sanctuary. This unique natural place was brought to the attention of the world nearly 15 years ago by a Buddhist monk, the Venerable Wanawasi Rahula Thero. Arrival and check-in at the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.




Jour 4 : Dambulla / Pidurangala / Hiriwadunna ou Minneriya

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to visit the rock Pidurangala with the monastery of ancient forests. This monastery complex covers an area of 13 hectares and illustrates the religious attitude of King Kashyapa who built the fortress of Sigiriya renowned worldwide during his reign. Pidurangala, the ancient monastery that is located next to Sigiriya Rock is considered the royal temple where King Kashyapa performed his devotions. According to legend, when Kashyapa arrived in Sigiriya to build his capital, the fortress, the surrounding caves were occupied by Buddhist monks observing the meditation. The king transferred the "Sigiriya Monastery complex" to Pidurangala, but some inscriptions say that Pidurangala was also a monastery beyond the Kashyapa period. In the afternoon, you can choose one of these visits:

Option 1: Visit the village of Hiriwadunna in oxcart, and boat on the lake. Tasting of a traditional meal.

Option 2: 4x4 safari in Minneriya National Park. The Minneriya National Park is located near three other parks, giving the area a wild character. He is well known for his large herds of wild elephants. In addition, Minneriya is located in Sri Lanka's famous Cultural Triangle where there are no less than five World Heritage Sites. Return to the hotel for dinner and overnight at the hotel.



Jour 5 : Dambulla / Riverston / Matale / Kandy

(150 km, 4h00 de route)

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure for Matale. Visit of "Riverston". Riverston Peak in Sri Lanka can be reached by traveling, about 30 km from the town of Matale, on the Matale - Girandurukotte road. This road offers some of the best views of the surrounding countryside; as far as it is called "mini world's end". The hike is about two and a half kilometers in one direction, and should not take more than an hour or two for people in good health. He runs a section known as Pittawala Paththana and leads to the Riverston Summit. Throughout the hike, you can admire the view of the rice terraces, unique to some mountainous areas of the world, and the beautiful green Central Highlands. Afternoon: visit of a spice garden in Matale. The Garden of spices in Matale offers all the native varieties to discover and sometimes to taste: bamboo, pepper, areca, banana, coffee, coconut, clove, cinnamon, nutmeg, vanilla, cardamom, etc. During this visit, each participant will receive a "massage of the head" with medicinal oils extracted from natural products. Visit the Buddha Tooth Temple in Kandy. The sacred tooth of the Buddha is the most revered relic among Buddhists in the country, it is at the temple in Kandy. In the Buddhist world, it is one of the most sacred places. According to legend, the tooth was recovered when the body of the Buddha was still in the funeral pyre. It was brought to Sri Lanka in 313 AD by the Indian princess Hemamali. In Sri Lankan history, the Sinhala kings did everything to protect it from invaders from South India. Arrival and check-in at the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.



Days 6 : Kandy / Meemure / Kandy (130 km, 3h30 of road) Breakfast at the hotel. Visit the village of Meemure (full day).Meemure is an isolated village in the central province of Sri Lanka, located 324 m above sea level and hidden among the mountains. The only way to reach it is from Hunnasgiriya Mountain, which is part of the Knuckles Range, about 50 km from Kandy. It is a difficult 33 km trail from Hunnasgiriya to Meemure, with many difficult places, although the view is excellent. The village itself receives abundant water in the form of waterfalls that have their sources in the evergreen forests of Knuckles. East of the village is the pyramid-shaped Lakegala Mountain, while the west is dominated by the picturesque Knuckles Range. The northern limit of Meemure borders a forest that extends to the "Pitawala Pathana" meadow; and the south is bounded by Heen River. Return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure for Kandy station to reach Nawalapitiya by local train (the train will leave at 08:40 from Kandy station and it will arrive at 09:45 at Nawalapitiya station). During the trip, you will enjoy the beautiful mountain scenery and tea plantations of this region. Departure for Kitulgala. You can choose one of these visits:

Option 1: White water rafting in Kitulgala (01h00 - 02h00)

Over the years, Kitulgala has become a popular destination for a variety of reasons. Surrounded by a good number of waterfalls, it is now the most important starting point for excursions in the surrounding area. The rafting trade has multiplied in this region whose turbulent waters are the delight of lovers of water sports. You can also have a drink at the location of the world famous movie "The Kwai River Bridge", which was shot here and not in Thailand. The place is quiet and the beautiful river in the heart of a lush jungle. The bridge is no longer there (it is destroyed with dynamite at the end of the film), but Kitulgala seduced anyway. Option 2: Trekking in the jungle (02h00 - 03h00)

Option 3: Canoeing (02h00 - 03h00)

Departure for Nuwara Eliya. Visit of a tea plantation and its manufacture. Tasting a real cup of Sri Lankan tea. Today, Sri Lankan tea is more commonly known as "Ceylon tea", after the name of the country until 1972. Ceylon produces almost only black tea, recognizable by its beautiful amber color. Arrival and check-in at the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

It is served by the Sri Lanka Railway Station on the Badulla branch. There is a spiral at this place. It is easily visible from the Demodara station. This is a tunnel that actually goes under the Demodara station. On the existing track, the tunnel is around a mountain, rising continuously to reach a higher altitude on what was the mountain under which the tunnel is built. Return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel



<mark>Day 9 : Nuwara Eliya / Sinharaja</mark> (150 km, 3h30 of road)

Breakfast at the hotel, and departure for Sinharaja via Ratnapura. Ratnapura is an important city in Sri Lanka. It is the capital of Sabaragamuwa province, as well as the district of Ratnapura, and is a traditional center of Sri Lanka for the jewelry trade. It is located on Kalu Ganga (Black River) in south-central Sri Lanka, some 101 km south of the country's capital, Colombo. The inhabitants of the city depend on the trade of precious stones. Visit of the precious stones mine. Arrival and check-in at the hotel.Afternoon: Sinharaja Forest Reserve is a national park and a hot spot of biodiversity in Sri Lanka. It is of international importance and has been designated a Biosphere Reserve and World Heritage Site by UNESCO. The hilly virgin forest, part of the lowland rainforest eco-region of Sri Lanka, was designated a World Biosphere Reserve in 1978 and World Heritage in 1988. Return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Day 1 : Colombo/ Negombo airport (15 km)

Arrival at Colombo International Airport. Welcome by our representative with garlands of frangipani flowers. Departure for Negombo, arrival and check-in at the hotel. Visit the city of Negombo, a major city of Sri Lanka, located on the west coast of the island and at the mouth of a lagoon. Negombo is the fourth largest city in the country after the capital Colombo, Kandy and Jaffna. It is one of Sri Lanka's main commercial centers, with about 128,000 inhabitants, about 37 km north of Colombo. Negombo is known for its very important fishing industry, its lively fish markets, and its beautiful sandy beaches. Return to the hotel for dinner, and overnight at the hotel.

Day 2 : Negombo / Chilaw / Anuradhapura (50 km, 1h of road / 130 km, 2h30 of road)

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure for Anuradhapura. Visit the Munneswaram temple. It is an important regional Hindu temple complex in Sri Lanka. It has been in existence since at least the year 100, although the myths surrounding the temple associate it with the famous Indian epic Ramayana and his legendary hero King Rama. The temple is one of five ancient temples dedicated to Shiva in the region. In the afternoon, visit the city of Anuradhapura, monuments of the 3rd century BC and 8 sacred temples for Buddhists.

Political and religious capital of Ceylon for 1,300 years, Anuradhapura was abandoned for Polonnaruwa in 993 following invasions. Long buried in thick jungle, the city, with its palaces and monasteries, is accessible again. Day 3 : Anuradhapura / Jaffna

(200 km, 5h of road)

Breakfast at the hotel, then departure of Anuradhapura. Arrival and check-in at the hotel. In the afternoon, visit the Jaffna Fortress. A remarkable embodiment of Hindu-Tamil culture, it is an archaeological monument to Sri Lanka's internal conflicts. While the construction of the current fort dates back to 1618, following the Portuguese invasion, there are indications that its layout dates back to the ancient Buddhist cultural expansion. During the colonial period, the British and the Dutch also held the fort under their governance, which led to the creation and destruction of certain segments. Inside, you will find a church with the statue of the Virgin Mary, the governor's residence, the garrison parade ground, and the queen's house, among other buildings of the Portuguese era. Arrival and check-in at the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Included meals: breakfast, lunch and dinner.



Day 4 : Jaffna

After breakfast, visit the city. Jaffna is the capital of the Northern Province. It was once capital of a Tamil kingdom. The city is very green and pleasant, and several neighborhoods deserve to get lost in order to better discover them. This is, of course, the case of the city center and its market,

the fort, but also Nallur and the entire area on both sides of Kandy Road. Among the beaches around Casuarina Beach, on the island of Karaitivu, is the most beautiful and the most famous. Visit Point Pedro, which is the northernmost city of Sri Lanka (it is also the third largest city in the region). His current name was given to him by a homonymous Portuguese settler. Its Tamil name is "Paruthithurai" which means "Port of cotton". In the afternoon, departure to visit "Nagadeepaya", built on the site where Buddha visited Sri Lanka for the second time, five years after attaining enlightenment. He intervened to settle a dispute between two Naga kings over the possession of a throne. Return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Day 5 : Jaffna / Trincomalee (240 km, 6h of road)

After breakfast, visit Dambakola Patuna which was used as a port at the time. This area is considered the place where Theri Sangamiththa landed with Bo Sapling. According to historical records, King Devanampiyathissa (250-210 BC) visited Dambakolapatuna to greet guests and Bo Sapling was later planted in Anuradhapura. It is the most sacred Sri Maha Bodhiya Jaya. Dambakola Patuna Viharaya (Jambokola Viharaya) was built to commemorate this event. Departure for Trincomalee. Afternoon: arrival and check-in at the hotel, then free time at the beach. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Included meals: breakfast, lunch and dinner.



Day 6 : Trincomalee / Polonnaruwa / Dambulla

(110 km, 2h de route / 70km, of road)

After breakfast, departure for Polonnaruwa.

Polonnaruwa was the second capital of Sri Lanka. It replaced Anuradhapura in 993 after the destruction of the latter by the Indian king Rajaraja. The Indian invaders built Hindu monuments, especially temples dedicated to the god Siva. Vijayabahu I, the Sinhalese king who repulsed the Tamil invaders in 1070, kept this city as his capital. He rebuilt Polonnaruwa with Buddhist monuments. The apogee of Polonnaruwa's glory began with King Parakramabahu and lasted from the 1st to the 12th century AD. 
Day 7 : Dambulla / Pidurangala / Hiriwadunna / Dambulla

Pidurangala, the ancient monastery next to Sigiriya Rock, is considered the royal temple where King Kashyapa performed his devotions. According to legend, when Kashyapa arrived in Sigiriya to build his capital, the fortress, the surrounding caves were occupied by Buddhist monks observing the meditation. The king transferred the "Sigiriya Monastery complex" to Pidurangala, but some inscriptions say that Pidurangala was also a monastery beyond the Kashyapa period. Afternoon: departure for the

village of Hiriwadunna to visit by oxcart, and boat on the lake. Opportunity to meet local people. Return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

It was declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1988. Return to the hotel. Dinner and overnight at the hotel.

Of Indian origin, he wanted to win the acceptance and affection of his people. He gave great importance to Buddhism and committed

to renovating old Buddhist temples and building new ones. According to Mahavamsa, (a historical record about Sri Lanka,) King Nissankamalla donated 73 golden sculptures to the Dambulla Temple and ordered a major renovation. The Dambulla Temple was named a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1991. Arrival and check-in at the hotel.

Day 3 : Dambulla / Sigiriya / Hiriwadunna / Dambulla

Breakfast at the hotel. Departure to visit the fortress of Sigiriya. Sigiriya is, still today, a prodigious place.
